• First Aid procedures for the following:


Allergic reaction	Envenomation, using pressure immobilization
Bites and stings	Fractures, sprains and strains, using arm slings, roller bandages or other appropriate immobilisation techniques
Anaphylaxis	Head, neck and spinal injuries
Bleeding control	Choking and airway obstruction
Stroke	Respiratory distress, including asthma
Shock	Cardiac conditions

- Considerations when providing first aid
- How to conduct a visual and verbal assessment of the casualty
- Principles and procedures for application of first aid management
- Manage an unconscious breathing casualty
- Followed the prompts of an automated external defibrillator (AED)
- State/Territory regulations, first aid codes of practice and workplace procedures including:
  - o ARC Guidelines for provision of CPR and First Aid to infants, children and adults
  - Safe work practices to minimise risks and potential hazards
  - Infection control principles and procedures
- Legal, workplace and community considerations, including:
  - o Consent, including situations in which parental/caregiver consent is required
  - Awareness of potential need for stress-management techniques and available support following an emergency situation, including the psychological impact on children
  - o Duty of care requirements
  - Privacy and confidentiality requirements
- Considerations when providing First Aid
  - Appropriate duration and cessation of CPR
  - Appropriate use of an AED, including placement of pads for adults and children aged older than 8 years
  - O Specific considerations when using an AED on children aged between 1 and 8 years
- Respectful behavior towards a casualty
- Perform Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation following the ARC guidelines, including:
  - Performed at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on an adult resuscitation manikin placed on the floor
  - o Performed at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) on an infant resuscitation manikin placed on a firm surface
